



## Appalachian Division

- Style: Inspired by the Seaboard Airline RR
- Era: 1960's – 1970's
- Scale: HO
- Size: Four deck around the room with peninsulas
- % Completed: Track 100%
- % Scenery: 80%
- Control: Digitrax
- Features: Operations by TT&TO using car cards and waybills



This is a quadruple deck, around the room layout with two peninsulas, however the lower deck is a staging yard only and does not and will not have scenery. The total mainline run is approximately 350 feet one way. The layout has return loops at each end of the railroad with the North End representing the trackage into Richmond, Virginia. The South End splits at the beginning of the return loop with one direction going to Columbia, SC and the other direction going to Atlanta, Ga. (in essence, both directions end in the staging yard).

The railroad operates on a Digitrax System. All of the turnouts (with two exceptions) are powered by Tortoise switch machines with the controls on the fascia boards at or near the turnouts with bi-polar, red/green LED indicator lights. The scenery is about 80 percent complete on the two peninsulas and the first and second level. The upper level is still a work in progress. Car movement is controlled by Car Cards and Waybills.
