November 2024 Layout Tour

Earlier in 2024, the Carolina Southern Division decided to try something new to help celebrate November as National Model Railroad month by having public and private layouts open to members and visitors. Assistant Superintendent Alan Hardee, and Treasurer Dave Thrams accepted the assignment given to them by the BOD. Through their efforts, 17 private layouts, and 3 public ones agreed to be open for viewing.


Due to the geography of the Division, they decided to divide up the area where the layouts were open into 4 regions to make it possible for the members and visitors to be able to see as many as possible during the month. Each region was assigned a specific Saturday (there being 4 Saturdays this November before Thanksgiving) so that made it easier to organize. A reservation page was placed on the CSD website (www.carolinasouthern.org) so that reservations could be made in advance. This enabled the layout owners to have an estimate of how many visitors might be attending, but it also provided 2 additional benefits. It encouraged members and visitors to visit the website, plus it kept the layout owners contact information off the web. The week of the open house, Dave sent the layout owners a list of the names of those who said they might be coming.

All feedback from both the layout owners and the visitors has been positive. Several of the layout owners I spoke to used this event to work on or finish a particular aspect of their layout. Some of the layouts that had not been operational were put into service. A number of scenery projects were completed. Also noteworthy, many of the layout owners used this opportunity to invite non model railroad friends or neighbors to check things out. While we have members (and layouts) in South Carolina, we had visitors from three states attend as we had a visitor drive in from Virginia to visit 3 of the layouts!




The layout of Dave Myers, Clerk






