The main 14'x17' island is composed of NTRAK modules. The concept is a small coal mine owned regional railroad with connections to the N&W/Southern/Norfolk Southern. One section was inspired by the unincorporated settlement of Elmwood on The "S Line" of the Norfolk Southern just east of Statesville, NC. Operations involve deliveries from the Class I railroads to the two small transfer yards, with local service to industries provided by the DD&DM.

The NTRAK "Mountain Division" branchline has a 'dogbone' configuration with automated passing track that allow two trains to operate simultaneously unattended.
